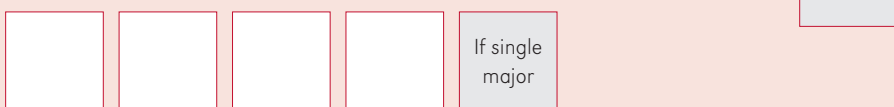

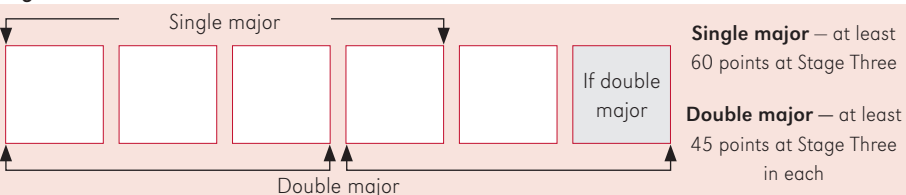

#### Important points for the BA component – Students must:

- Complete the requirements for **either** a single major (135 points (nine courses), including 60 points (four courses) at Stage Three) **or** a double major (120 points (eight courses), including 45 points (three courses) at Stage Three per major).
- Some majors have specific core requirements. Consult the University Calendar, Arts Students' Centre or the Arts Undergraduate Handbook for more details.
- Complete at least 150 points above Stage One.
- Complete at least 75 points at Stage Three regardless of single or double major status.

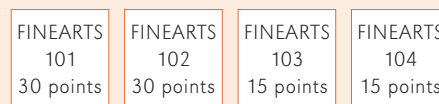

It is the students' responsibility to check that they meet the requirements of their plan (single or double major) and that the final programme conforms to University regulations.

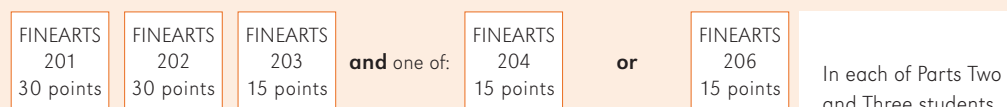

### Part One – 90 points

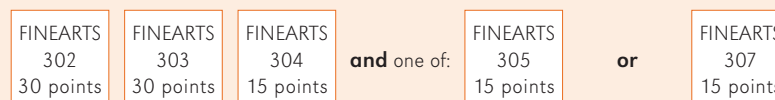


### Part Two – 90 points

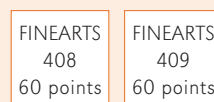


In each of Parts Two and Three students can elect to enrol in either a Fields of Practice or a Critical Studies course.

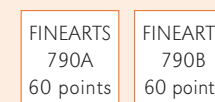
### Part Three – 90 points



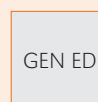
### Part Four – 120 points

- On completion of Parts One, Two and Three a student who achieves an average grade of B or higher in Part Three 90 points FINEARTS courses will be eligible to apply for admission to the degree of Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Fine Arts (Honours).

# BA/BFA Conjoint Degree Planner

## BA Component Degree Structure

- For the BA component of the conjoint degree you need to complete a minimum of 270 points.
- At least 255 points must come from courses listed in the BA schedule – see *The University of Auckland Calendar/Arts Undergraduate Handbook* for full listing.
- The remaining 15 points must come from appropriate General Education (GEN ED) courses for the programme and subject interest – see [www.auckland.ac.nz/generaleducation](http://www.auckland.ac.nz/generaleducation) for more information.
- As all Arts courses (except DRAMA 204) are 15 points each in value, you will usually require a minimum of 18 courses to complete the BA component of the conjoint degree.
- At least 150 points must be above Stage One (including at least 75 points at Stage Three).
- You must complete the requirements for either a single major or a double major.
- For a single major, you need to complete at least 135 points in your major, including at least 60 points at Stage Three.
- For a double major, you need to complete at least 120 points in each major, with at least 45 points above Stage Two in both subjects.
- There may also be further subject requirements and/or core courses required for your major(s) – check *The University of Auckland Calendar/Arts Undergraduate Handbook*.
- There is no minor in a BA conjoint degree.

**You are not able to include courses from outside of the BA or BFA schedules towards the conjoint degree, even if they are available for other University of Auckland programmes.**

## Enrolment Pattern

- BA/BFA conjoint degree takes a minimum of five years to complete.
- You are recommended to enrol in not more than 135 points in the first year of BA/BFA (with no more than 60 points in the first semester of enrolment).
- In your first year, for the BFA component, you should enrol in FINEARTS 101 (30 points), FINEARTS 102 (30 points), FINEARTS 103 (15 Points) and FINEARTS 104 (15 points) and for the BA component, you should enrol in two to three BA courses (15 points each) with at least two courses in the same BA subject.
- You are advised not to take the General Education courses required for the conjoint degree in your first year of study.
- To complete in a minimum of five years, BA/BFA students would usually enrol in 135 points each year. There is no requirement, however, to complete within the minimum time of five years, and students may enrol in a more manageable study load and extend the overall time frame.
- The University of Auckland Calendar defines fulltime study as enrolment in no less than 100 points in an academic year, or no less than 50 points in one semester, or no less than 25 points in Summer School.
- The University of Auckland Calendar states that the maximum number of points a student may enrol in over a single academic year is 170 points (students can enrol in up to 80 points in each of Semester One and Two, and up to 30 points in Summer School provided the overall limit is not exceeded).
- In order to continue in a conjoint degrees combination a student needs to achieve a Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.5 each year.
